

2024 Large Grants

The Board made three grants over \$250,000 in 2024. The largest grant was \$500,000 in support of Pine Rest Hospital's Pediatric Center for Behavior Health. The grant, payable over 3 years, is recognized by naming of Peter C. & Emajean Cook Foundation Group Visit Room. Well positioned to allievate overload in youth mental health treatments, the project includes the first Pediatric behavior health emergency room.

There were two grants at \$300,000, both payable over 3 years. Van Andel Institute received a commitment to their Scored Grant Award, Program, helping fund those projects just short of attaining National Institute of Health or other public support. The Foundation also funded the Imagine Campaign of Habitat for Humanity of Kent County. The campaign supports their initiative to build or rehab one hundred homes in the next 3 years. The majority of these houses will be in Roosevelt Park neighborhood.

Fourth Quarter 2024 Grant Expense Reporting

The Board met November 20, 2024 their final meeting of 2024 and approved grant expense of \$349,680.
