### **Western Theological Seminary**

Combining concerns regarding mental health and waning Christianity, our largest grant this quarter was to Western Theological Seminary to help launch their Master of Arts in Clinical Mental Health Counseling. This two-year in residence program will prepare graduates to be qualified counselors with a Christian perspective.

Our \$350,000 grant is to be paid over five years beginning in 2024.

# Equest Center for Therapeutic Riding, Hand2Hand and YMCA

The above organizations were all awarded \$50,000 capital grants to support on-going campaigns. Since 1990, Equest Center has been successfully providing therapeutic riding to challenged individuals and they are expanding to better serve their clients. Hand2Hand needed the funds to match a donation for a refrigerated box truck allowing them easier transport of fresh and refrigerated foods. The YMCA is expanding their footprint in Lowell to add a daycare center.



### By the Numbers

The Foundation Board approved grants totaling \$705,005 funding 16 organizations during Q3 2023. Grants ranged from \$4,500 to \$350,000 with the median grant \$25,000.

All but three grants had a West Michigan impact. Just 28% of grant dollars were for capital projects this quarter as the large Western Seminary grant supports a program launch. Just 8% supported the Grandville Avenue neighborhood this quarter. Successfully trying to be intentional about funding Christian projects, 82% of funding went to Christian organizations. There were no new grantees this quarter.
