

2025 Large Grants

The Board made just two grants of \$250,000 or more 2025. The largest grant was \$500,000 in support of ICCF's Building With Faith Capital Campaign. The grant is payable over 5 years, supporting innovative and collaberative housing projects. The other large grant was \$250,000 to St Mary's Foundation to help renovate the Hauenstein Center and add a Pain Clinic. This grant will be funded over 5 years and is part of a much larger campaign designed to update and improve patient experiences and medical efficiencies.

There were two grants at \$200,000, both payable over 2 years. The Grand Rapids Publicm Museum received a commitment to provide additional funding for the Cook Carousel renovation. In reply, benches honoring each grandchild will be placed in the carousel waiting area. The newly installed ticket Kiosk will be named for Peter's son, Tom Cook. The carousel will reopen in early 2026 creating a enhanced and more accessible experience.

Note that large grants are almost always multi-year. The Foundation reserves the right to prepay and most often does accelerate payment. Some grants may have been paid by the Foundation's Donor Advised Fund at the Grand Rapids Community Foundation.
