Additional Data Points

In addition during Q3, \$96,500 was granted to 9 organizations at amounts below \$25,000.

In Q2, \$198,000 was awarded to organizations either located in or projects dedicated to serving the Roosevelt Park neighborhood. Combined with earlier 2025 grants targeting Roosevelt Park, the year-to-date investment now totals \$496,000.
