| David's House Ministries | Forever Homes Campaign - To help fund House #7. This Christian organization operates a complex of homes serving those with special needs. | \$125,000 |
| Grand Rapids Community Foundation | 100th Anniversary Campaign Grant - Somos Comunidad Fund Commitment. Will provide funding to grassroots Latino organizations. This is a two year grant. | \$100,000 |
| Grandville Avenue Arts & Humanities | Operating support for the Cook Arts Center and the Cook Library. Both buildings are located in and focused on serving the Roosevelt Park neighborhood. | \$100,000 |
| Pine Rest Foundation | Support for the Pediatric Center for Behavioral Health Capital Campaign. The 136,000 square feet, \$86M project is anticipated to treat an additional 13,000 adolescents with both inpatient and outpatient services. This is a three year grant. | \$500,000 |
| Van Andel Institute | Support for their Scored Grant Award Program. This program helps gather data to secure NIH funding. This is a three year grant. | \$300,000 |

| Daffodil Ministries | Funds for this Christian, volunteer lead organization to acquire a duplex used to house those dealing with domestic violence on a transitional basis. | \$25,000 |

| Exalta Health | 2024 operating support for this Christian health clinic serving low income and uninsured with healthcare vulnerabilities. | \$40,000 |
| Gilda's Living with Communities | Funding for this cancer support center comes in multiple ways: \$20k for their Red Door Gala match, \$15k for their Christian counseling programming and \$15k for other challenge matches. | \$50,000 |
| Grace Adventures | Capital Campaign gap funding grant is in addition to a \$100k grant made in 2022 to fund a new Common/Dining/Gathering building at this Christian camp in Mears, Michigan. | \$50,000 |
| Grace Reformed Church | Support for Christian Reformed Church located in Wyoming, Michigan. Peter and Pat Cook were lifelong members at Grace. | \$59,400 |
| Grand Valley University Foundation | Operating support for the Peter C. Cook Leadership Academy. The academy is programming of the Hauenstein Center for Presidential Studies. | \$50,000 |
| Junior Achievement | Programming focused on the Roosevelt Park neighborhood and a \$25k challenge grant to support WCSG as media partner in BizTown, JA's new interactive programming site. | \$35,000 |
| Our Daily Bread | Support for the prison ministry and distribution of devotions in U.S. prisons and jails. With dedicated prison ministry staffing, reaching just under 50% of all U.S. prison facilities. | \$30,000 |
| Potter's House | Operating support for this elementary Christian school located in Roosevelt Park. The student body of 400 plus students is intentionally diverse. | \$50,000 |
| Roosevelt Park Neighborhood Association | Operating support for the neighborhood association located in Roosevelt Park. The staff works with the City of Grand Rapids to improve and protect the neighborhood of Peter's youth. | \$48,000 |
| Samaritas | Challenge match funds for their Refugee Mobile App. | \$25,000 |
| The Green Apple Pantry | Operating funds for this Kentwood pantry. They served 4,400 households last year with emergency resources or government commodities. | \$48,000 |
| Women at Risk International | After care support for the women rescued by this Christian organization working to save women and girls from sex trafficking, both in the US and internationally. | \$25,000 |
